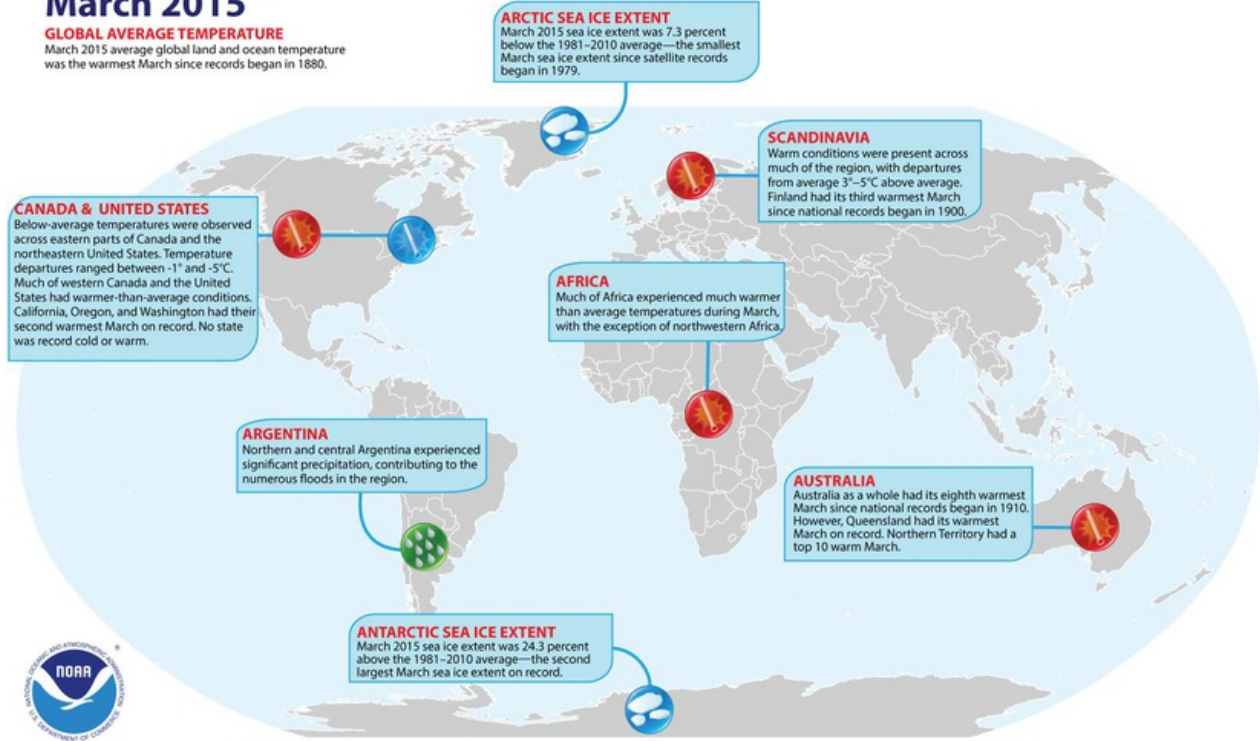

Selected Significant Climate Events

March 2015

GLOBAL AVERAGE TEMPERATURE

March 2015 average global land and ocean temperature was the warmest March since records began in 1880.

CANADA & UNITED STATES

Below-average temperatures were observed across eastern parts of Canada and the northeastern United States. Temperature departures ranged between -1° and -5°C . Much of western Canada and the United States had warmer-than-average conditions. California, Oregon, and Washington had their second warmest March on record. No state was record cold or warm.

ARGENTINA

Northern and central Argentina experienced significant precipitation, contributing to numerous floods in the region.
